Hi Parents!

We are so excited to have your child attend camp with us this summer! Please read this entire packet and email abueermann@clearcreek.org if you have any questions!

DEPARTURE

We will begin check-in at the Egret Bay Campus at 1:00pm for all camps.

10th-12th grade departs June 19th

8th-9th grade departs June 23rd

6th-7th grade departs June 27th

This year students will check-in at their bus. Please take your child and their luggage to the bus sign with their bus number. Students will load their luggage and then board the bus.

Once the students board their bus, they are our responsibility and will not be permitted to exit the bus. Students and leaders will travel on charter buses with bathrooms to and from camp. Please have your student eat lunch before they arrive for check-in.

We do not plan on having anyone enter the church building unless there is bad weather. Please note: the same buses dropping students off from the previous camp are taking the next group, so there may be slight adjustments. A final email about check-in will be sent 2 days before camp with any additional instructions.

RETURN

We are planning on arriving back at the Egret Bay Campus at 12:30p for all camps.

10th-12th grade return June 23rd

8th-9th grade return June 27th

6th-7th grade return July 1st

We will keep you updated with ETA via text message. Once we arrive back at the church, students are released to you as they exit their buses. Please get your student and their luggage and leave the parking lot as soon as possible.

COMMUNICATION

To minimize distractions, students will not have access to their phones, tablets, and data enabled watches. **Please keep all these devices at home.** If a student does bring a device, they will be taken up as soon as they arrive at the church and will not be returned until the buses arrive back at the church. We are not responsible for any lost or damaged devices.

If a student would like to contact their parents, we will make an adult's phone available to them.

While your child is at camp, please answer the phone from any number, as it may be a camp medical team member.

Social media will be updated daily so follow **@ccccstudents** on Facebook and Instagram for a glimpse of camp!

We will not be able to receive any mail at camp. One way to send encouragement to your child is to put notes in their luggage before they leave.

MEDICATIONS

We have a team of doctors and nurses from Clear Creek Community Church who volunteer their time to care for our students at camp.

All medication must be in the original packaging and not expired.

Prescription medication must be in the original container or box (including inhalers and emergency injectors), not expired, and with prescription label with the student's name and correct dosage information.

Over the counter medications must be in the original container and not expired. Please make sure the medication has the appropriate dosing instructions for the student's age.

If you do not bring medications in their original containers or they are expired, we cannot dispense that medication. If your child cannot attend camp safely without that medication, they will not be allowed on the bus. This is a state law.

All medications must be turned in to and held by the camp medical team. Students are not allowed to self-medicate, and leaders are not allowed to give medication to a student. Please fill out the medical form and follow all the directions.

We provide typical over-the-counter medications (Advil, Tylenol, Tums, Pepto, Zyrtec, etc.). If your student occasionally needs these over-the-counter medications, please do not send them. If your student has an over-the-counter medication that they take daily (ex. a daily allergy medication), please follow the medication procedures below.

Emergency rescue medications like epi pens and asthma rescue inhalers can be kept by your student (if they can self-administer) **only if** a second set of that medication is also provided to the medical team. We prefer they are kept by the medical team as students often have trouble keeping up with their emergency medications at camp. **Even if a student**

is self-carrying, we need the medication form completed and the medication given to the medical staff at drop off to make sure it is packaged correctly.

Your student is responsible for stopping by the medical team table during mealtimes or the medical team cabin at night to receive medicines. The medical team will not track down students to give them their meds, except for life-threatening medical conditions.

If possible, please only send the amount of medication needed for the time we are at camp. Empty medication containers can be sent home with the student. All empty containers left will be disposed of and extra medication that was not given can be picked up in the church when we return from camp.

When dropping off medications please package as follows:

- Correctly packaged medication
- Printed copy of completed medication form
- Medication and form in a gallon sized Ziplock bag with the students first and last name written at the top

We strongly encourage you to drop off medication ahead of time to streamline your check-in process the day of departure.

PACKING LIST

Everything your child brings to camp must be labeled. Everything that will go under the bus needs a luggage tag. Luggage tags will be available at the parent meeting and at the luggage tag pick up/medication drop off dates listed in the medication section above.

We are asking students and adults to follow [CCISD](#) and the camps dress code while at camp

Dress Code

- No clothing that reveals undergarments
- No short shorts or skirts (must completely cover your bottom)
- Shirts must touch the top of your shorts.
- No speedos or midriff-baring bathing suits (must wear a one piece, or a tankini bathing suit but the top must touch the bottoms, or may wear a dark t-shirt over swimsuit)
- No clothing with questionable sayings, slogans, etc.
- Closed toes shoes are required for rec and certain [free time activities](#)

CCCC Rules and Code of Conduct for all Student Ministry Camps

BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

These behavioral expectations create a safe and fun environment for all campers. If questions or concerns arise before, during, or after camp, please reach out to a student ministry staff member or Student Director.

- If a student refuses to follow these behavioral expectations, the student will be addressed by their group leader to resolve the behavioral issue.
- If the behavioral issue becomes a discipline problem, the group leader will communicate with a Student Director.
- If necessary, parents will be notified.
- If necessary, the student will be sent home at the parent's expense.

Please review the following behavior expectations with your student before camp:

1. No bullying.
2. No use of alcohol, drugs, tobacco, vapes, or weapons of any kind.
3. No public display of affection (PDA).
4. No guys in girls' dorms or girls in guys' dorms.
5. No food or drinks in the meeting rooms.
6. No foul language is allowed.
7. No use of cell phones or electronic devices. **All phones/devices will be collected before students board buses.** Any student found using an electronic device during camp will have it taken away.
8. Lights out in cabins required during designated times.
9. No leaving the established camp boundaries at any time.
10. Everyone is required to attend all scheduled meetings and group activities.
11. Respect others' property. If you have not been given permission to borrow or use another person's things, do not do so.
12. Respect camp property. Replacement fees for any broken, damaged, or vandalized items will be at the expense of those at fault.
13. FOOL'S RULE: If you think something is foolish or might be considered foolish by someone else, DON'T DO IT!

THE BUDDY SYSTEM

We adhere to the buddy system during all camps.

In practice, the buddy system means:

- No student walks to and from activities alone
- No student is alone during free time
- No student or students are allowed to walk to remote or out of the way areas

THE OPEN DOOR POLICY

For the protection of leaders and students, we have an open-door policy for camps. All interior hallway doors in camp dorms will always remain open. To change clothes, students and leaders use the bathroom. Only students and leaders of the same gender are allowed in each designated dorm. No student is allowed in a room alone with an adult.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

- Alcohol
- Drugs of any kind
- Tobacco or nicotine products of any kind, including vapes, etc.
- Weapons, including knives
- Prank supplies, fireworks or matches
- Skateboards, rollerblades
- Computers, portable video games, DVD players
- Phones and smart watches
